





# Higher Education Volumes






### Mapping the Future: Charting Individual Growth and Collaborative Leadership

### Courage to Care: Exploring Connection between Self and Others





Participants in this program explore selections from Homer's *The Odyssey* and from contemporary work—including many by veterans—about service and war to reflect on their own experiences and journeys.



### Exploring American Perspectives



Each of the 22 lessons fosters and enhances problem-solving, critical thinking, and leadership through direct practice.

### New Landscapes


